COVID 19 VACCINES



What is a vaccination?

Vaccinations are a simple, safe, and effective way to protect people against harmful diseases before they come into contact with them. It uses your body's natural defenses to build resistance to specific infections and makes your immune system stronger.

How do vaccines work?

Vaccines train your immune system to create antibodies, just as it does when it is exposed to a disease. When you get a vaccine, your immune system responds by recognising the invading germ and producing antibodies. Antibodies are proteins produced naturally by the immune system to fight disease. Your body remembers the disease and how to fight it. If you are then exposed to the germ in the future, your immune system can quickly destroy it before you become unwell. However, because vaccines contain only killed or weakened forms of germs like viruses or bacteria, they do not cause the disease or put you at risk of its complications.

What is the benefit of a COVID-19 vaccine?

COVID-19 vaccines protect you from severe illness and death from the virus by helping the body develop immunity. They may also help reduce the spread of the virus between people, so one person's choice to get vaccinated could save many more lives.

COVID-19 vaccines are a key tool in ending the pandemic and getting societies back to normal. Mass vaccination campaigns should also help reduce the pressure on health workers and hospitals, allowing them to attend to patients with other conditions.

Should I get vaccinated?

Two key reasons to get vaccinated are to protect ourselves and to protect those around us. Because not everyone can be vaccinated – including very young babies, those who are seriously ill or have certain allergies – they depend on others being vaccinated to ensure they are also safe from vaccine-preventable diseases.

Are Covid-19 vaccines safe?

Yes. There are strict protections in place to help ensure the safety of all COVID-19 vaccines. Before receiving authorisation from the World Health Organization (WHO) and the South African Health Products Regulatory Authority (SAHPRA), COVID-19 vaccines undergo rigorous testing in clinical trials to prove that they meet internationally agreed standards for safety and efficacy.

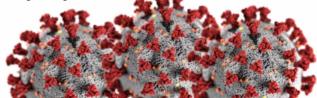
Hundreds of millions of vaccine doses have been administered globally and millions of people have already safely received COVID-19 vaccines in Africa.

Are Covid-19 vaccines effective?

Yes. Data from clinical trials and now data coming from use in real life settings is showing that COVID-19 vaccines authorised for use are highly effective in protecting against severe illness and death from COVID-19.

Where can I register for the vaccine?

If you qualify to be vaccinated, you can register on the Department of Health Electronic Vaccination Data System (EVDS) in one of four ways. You can register on the website, using WhatsApp, or on your phone using USSD, or by calling 0800 029 999. Speak to the SHEQ team if you need assistance registering.

SUPPLY CHAIN CHANGES

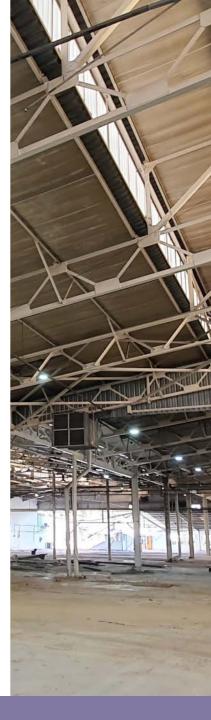
Planning will now extend to include maintenance planning. The basic goal of planning and scheduling is avoiding delay. The role of the Maintenance planner is to improve work force productivity and work quality by anticipating and eliminating potential delays through planning and coordination of labour, parts and materials.

Procurement is also making some valuable moves including the implementation of DocuVision, a system that will receive, track, manage and store documents. They are also setting up a preferred supplier list, contracts and service level agreements that will ensure that we have guaranteed quality of goods from suppliers. Additionally, Procurement is moving towards becoming ISO Compliant, which, as previously mentioned, will help the Company immensely.

A new Warehouse Management system will be implemented within DC that will help track where stock is and how much of it there is. This means that there will be better stock management! On top of this, new equipment will be used in DC to ensure that time and money is saved. These machines include an inline wrapper and pallet invertor.

Other new features to the supply chain include vehicle trackers in our Company vehicles that will help predict and prevent accidents, record footage, and track driving behaviours to keep our drivers awake and safe!
